Some assembled buckets of supplies and delivered them to the north Nashville area, some placed tarps on damaged homes and others organized donations for the McGruder Family Resource Center.

We challenged our project teams and departments to volunteer individually, together, socially distant, virtually, and the many ways available to us in 2020.

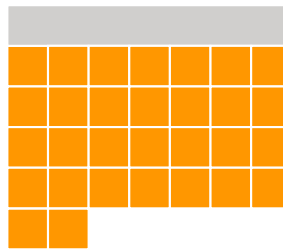
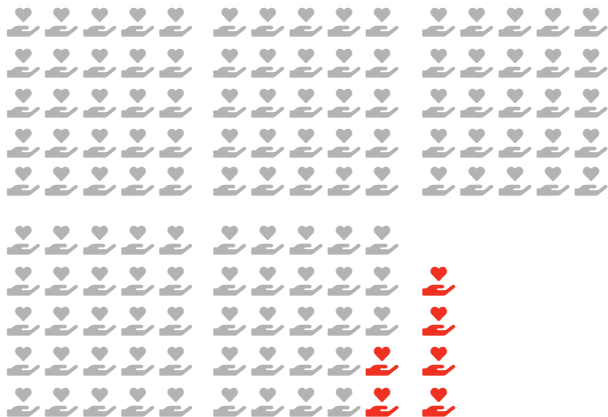
