Our Southeast Georgia Health System project team in Brunswick, Georgia, supports Safe Harbor Children's Center, Inc., and participated in several volunteer activities.

The center's Street Outreach Program provides youth services for those who are experiencing homelessness and utilizes homes in the area as a resource. The team helped repair minor damages to two of these homes and completed necessary upgrades.



to charitable organizations including \$600K to community-related organizations, and \$1.48M for causes in partnership with clients and industry partners.


We gave to more than 113 organizations, 22 of which we have at least a 10-year relationship with.
