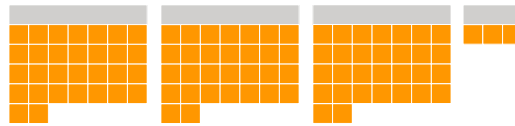
to charitable organizations, including **\$710,000** to community-related organizations and **\$1.5 Million** for causes in partnership with clients and industry partners.

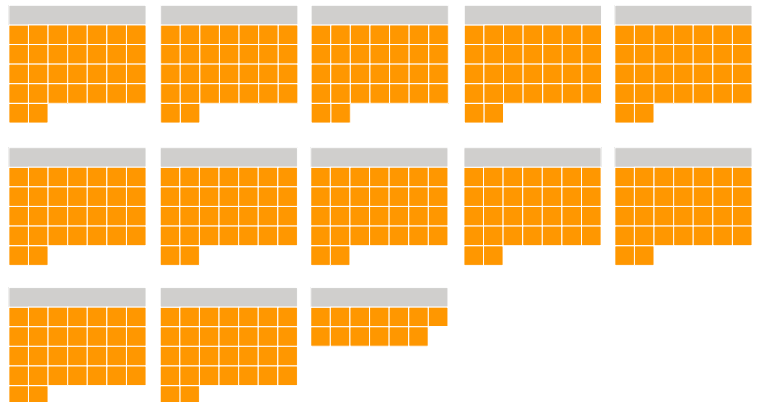


We gave to more than 150 organizations.
